The disclosure of the Commercially Sensitive Information contained has the potential to infringe commercial interests by undermining the legitimacy and integrity of the current procurement competition if the information requested is shared with any of the participants in the procurement competition. There is a financial, legal and reputational risk to the Contracting Authority if commercially sensitive information is released during a procurement process. Tenderers could be discouraged from competing for future competitions with the council. There is a public interest in ensuring that private sector companies can compete on an equitable and legal basis for contracting authorities contracts and the disclosure of the requested information could compromise their ability to do so.

PUBLIC INTEREST DECISION: After weighing up the competing public interest considerations, we consider it is reasonable in all the circumstances that the information held should be withheld from disclosure under Section 43(2) of the FOI Act and that the public interest in maintaining the exemption outweighs the public interest in disclosure.
